OPM's ability to achieve its mission to build a high-quality and diverse federal workforce depends heavily on the ability of its decision makers and managers to make fact-based and timely decisions. To succeed, OPM needs reliable, timely, and consistent financial information that enables effective management of its resources and delivery of mission products and services throughout the nation. With this type of information, an OPM program manager can, for example, identify projects that are not self-sustaining (full cost recovery) and target them for improvement or potential termination. Timely and accurate information also enables a program manager to produce a project plan with resource requirements and costs to determine if it makes economic sense to pursue a new business opportunity. Readily available financial information also enables OPM to quickly determine the status of funds for decision making.
