History of Personal Health Record Pilots at CMS

2005 -RFI solicited public feedback on CMS role re: PHRs

 Outcome: Industry concurred that CMS should not build proprietary PHR, but should provide Medicare data to existing PHRs

2006 –Feasibility test

 Outcome: Successfully tested transfer of Medicare claims data into existing Internetbased PHRs

2007-2008 -Plan Pilot

Outcome: Studied beneficiary usage of existing PHRs offered by MA and Part D plans

 range of plans and uptake, from 100,000 for Kaiser to 400 for UPMC. Evaluation
 completed in Summer 2009; positive feedback from users.

2008 -Concept of Operations

 Outcome: Identified technical and policy implications of providing Medicare claims data to PHRs on a large scale

2008 to present –Fee–for–Service Pilots

 Outcome: Two pilots -single PHR in South Carolina; choice of 4 PHRs in Arizona and Utah. Outreach found to be very important. Evaluation completed in Spring 2010 for South Carolina. 4500 registrants for MyPHRSC; 1200 for PHRChoice. Ended in 2011.

Blue Button Background

- Joint initiative with Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
 - Todd Park, CIO DHHS
 - Peter Levin, CIO VA
- Currently, Medicare beneficiaries can access their claims data on www.mymedicare.gov, and can add personal information into that site as well. They can then create and print a report called the "Onthe-Go report" to share with their caregivers and providers.
- There have been 3 releases for the "Blue Button" on MyMedicare.gov: September 2010 launch, October 2010 migration to new look and feel, June 2011 addition of diagnosis codes to the beneficiary file



Blue Button allow s beneficiaries to download their data for their own personal use

- The MyMedicare.gov web portal was launched in December 2004 as a pilot in Indiana.
- The national rollout was completed in the fall of 2005.
- As a companion to the Medicare.gov website, the portal provides a secure web interface where beneficiaries can have access to personalized information regarding their Medicare benefits and services.
- Began auto-enrolling newly eligible beneficiaries in August 2006 (for Mymedicare.gov)



Current MyMedicare.gov Functionality

Key Functions:

- Online access to various claims views (claims summaries, claim details and claim based MSN's)
- Captures prescriptions entered and saved by the beneficiary
- Ability to enter personal information related to their health
- Ability to create an "On the Go" report
- Ability to submit an Initial Enrollment Questionnaire (IEQ) online
- Detailed enrollment information (current plans, Medicare secondary payer info)
- Preventive service history and notifications
- Medicare Secondary Payer (MSP) case access for liability cases
- Ability to email targeted messaging
- Opt out of the Medicare Handbook

- The Blue Button is available on the "Claims" and "On the Go Report" screens
- Button will only download the data that is visible on that page



- Once the user "pushes" the blue button, they get an instruction page.
- There is language on this page to warn beneficiaries to protect this information and not download it on public computers

- The File Download Dialog box will open.
 Select "Save" and enter the location, name and type of your file.
 Once the file is saved on your computer, it can be opened and viewed in Excel.
 - To open a file in Excel, right click on the file name

 - Select Excel. If Excel does not display, then select "Choose Program" and find Excel in the list




- The Medicare Beneficiary Portal provides Medicare beneficiaries with a browser-based graphical user interface to retrieve relevant beneficiary information
