## Section 2. How we change for 2008

---

Do not rely only on these change descriptions; this Section is not an official statement of benefits. For that, go to Section 5 Benefits. Also, we edited and clarified language throughout the brochure. Any language change not shown here is a clarification that does not change benefits.

### Changes to this Plan

- United States Postal Service non-law enforcement career employees may now be covered either by Postal Category 1 or Postal Category 2 premium rates. See page 78.

### Changes to High Option only

- Your share of the non-Postal premium will increase. See page 78.
- Copayments for specialized scans (MRI, CT and PET) will increase from no charge to \$100 per department visit. See page 18.
- Copayments for adult preventive care routine examinations will decrease from \$15 to no charge. See page 18.
- Copayments for well-child office visits will decrease from \$15 to no charge. See page 19.
- Copayments for prenatal office visits will decrease from \$15 to no charge. See page 20.
- Copayment for outpatient surgeries performed in an operating room and for colonoscopy and sigmoidoscopy screenings will increase from \$15 to \$50. See page 18 and 30.

### Changes to Standard Option only

- Your share of the non-Postal premium will increase. See page 78.
- Copayments for specialized scans (MRI, CT and PET) will increase from \$20 to \$100 per department visit. See page 18.
- Copayments for adult preventive care routine examinations will decrease from \$20 to no charge. See page 18.
- Copayments for well-child office visits will decrease from \$20 to no charge. See page 19.
- Copayments for prenatal office visits will decrease from \$20 to no charge. See page 20.
- Copayments for multidisciplinary rehabilitation will increase from \$20 to \$30 per day. See page 22.
- Copayment for colonoscopy and sigmoidoscopy screenings will increase from \$20 to \$100. See page 18.
- Copayments for office visits in a hospital emergency department will increase from \$75 to \$100. See page 41.

### Changes to Both High and Standard Options

- We changed the multidisciplinary rehabilitation benefit limit from two months to 60 days. See page 22.
- We added coverage for hearing aids (including testing and examinations for them) for children under age 18. The benefit provides coverage for up to \$1,000 for each hearing impaired ear every 36 months. See page 23.
