BIOGRAPHY

Lisa Loss

Lisa M. Loss brings more than 25 years of experience in personnel security investigations to the U.S. Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) Federal Investigative Services (FIS). Lisa is responsible for policy direction to federal and contract investigators as well as operational guidance to Federal agencies. Under her direction, FIS conducts liaison with the more than 100 Federal agencies OPM serves, training of Executive Branch investigators and adjudicators through its federally accredited National Training Center, oversight of federal agencies' suitability and security programs, and records management of historical investigations in one of the Government's largest Freedom of Information and Privacy Act offices.

Lisa began her Federal career in November 1987 as a Special Agent with the Defense Investigative Service. Prior to joining OPM, she was the Special Agent in Charge at the Northern Virginia Field Office in Annandale, Virginia. In 2005, Lisa was appointed to a policy position with OPM-FIS, later becoming the Policy Program Manager and Assistant Director for External Affairs. Since 2007, she has represented OPM on a number of dedicated task forces to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of suitability and security investigations and adjudications. Lisa co-chaired the interagency working group that revised the Federal Investigative Standards for credentialing, suitability, fitness and security clearance investigations. The Director of National Intelligence and Director of OPM issued the revised standards in December 2012. Lisa is the chair of the Background Investigations Stakeholders Group and also represents OPM on a number of interagency working groups regarding vetting policies and processes. In 2013, Lisa assisted the President's Security and Suitability Process Review. In February 2014, Lisa was named to the Advisory Council for the Performance Accountability Council's Program Management Office, which is responsible for implementing priority goals and devising an enterprise IT structure for Federal vetting.

Lisa resides in Oakton, Virginia, with her husband Jeff and two children.



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
