Subject: 2012 FEHB Open Season for Tribal Employees: Ordering and Distributing Materials

This Tribal Benefits Administration Letter (TBAL) is the second in our series of 2012 Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Open Season for Tribal Employees TBALs. This TBAL (12-702) provides instructions for ordering and distributing FEHB Open Season materials.

Please distribute Attachment 1, Going Green – View Your FEHB Brochure Online or Contact Your Plan for a Paper Brochure, to your tribal employees. We previously described our continuing Going Green initiative in TBAL 12-701. This effort has a two-fold purpose:

1) to provide tribal employees the option of viewing brochures online or to receive a

paper copy of their health plan's brochure; and,

2) to limit the number of brochures printed and distributed to tribal employers.
