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## Section 2 How we change for 2007

Also, we edited and clarified language throughout the brochure; any language change not shown here is a clarification that does not change benefits.

### Changes to this Plan

- Your share of the non-Postal premium for enrollment code B9 for the High Option will increase by 14.2% for Self Only coverage or 8.5% for Self and Family coverage.
- Copayments for Primary Care Physician office visits will decrease to \$10 per visit. See page 16.
- Copayments for Outpatient Surgical Facilities will increase to \$50 per visit. See page 33.
- Copayments for childhood immunizations for children from birth to age 5 will decrease from \$20 to \$0. See page 18.
- Copayments for prescription drugs purchased at a retail Plan pharmacy will decrease to \$7 Tier 1, and \$25 Tier 2. See page 40.
- Copayments for prescription drugs purchased through Plan mail order will decrease to \$17.50 Tier 1, and \$62.50 Tier 2. See page 40..
- Copayments for specialty prescription drugs will be \$7 Tier 1, \$25 Tier 2, and \$50 Tier 3 for a 30-day supply. See page 41.
- Chiropractic limitation on visits will increase from 24 to 26 visits per calendar year. See page 24.
- Service area expansion: We have added the metropolitan areas of Jefferson City and Springfield, MO to the enrollment code B9. For complete listing of service area for 2007 see page 7.
- Service area reduction St. Louis metropolitan area: Dunklin, Howell, New Madrid, Pemiscot and Stoddard counties have been removed from the B9 enrollment code. For a complete listing of the service area see page 7.
- We now require that you use the Specialty Pharmacy Program for prescription drugs to treat specific conditions. See page 41.
- We now cover genetic counseling. See page 19.
