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Purpose

This document presents an overview of the characteristics of the Senior Executive Service (SES), providing the public and analysts access to commonly requested descriptive information.

This document presents data in the form of tables and charts on the current and historical composition of the Senior Executive Service.

Data

The statistics in all tables and charts in this paper are restricted to pay plan ES. If dates are not clearly labeled in the tables and charts, the data is restricted to Fiscal Year 2018.

Figure 1. SES Appointment Trends is a graphical representation of the totals in Table 2.

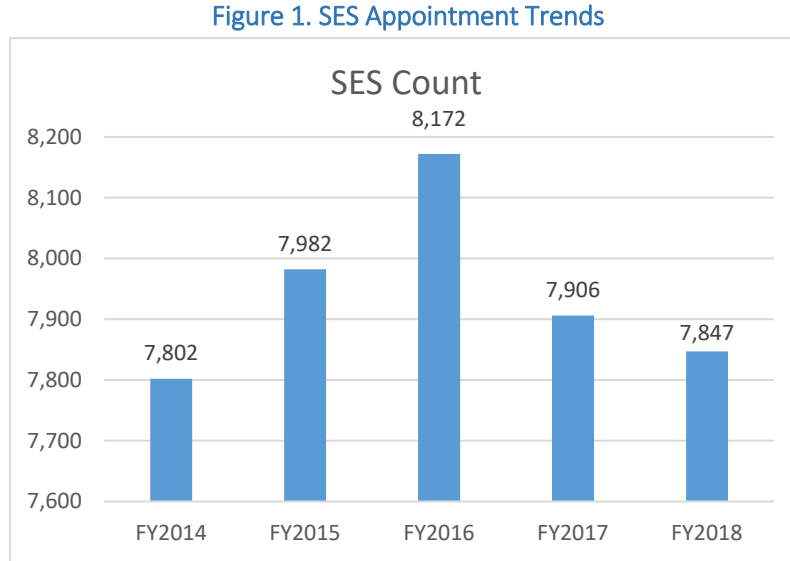

Table 5. SES Age Trends lists the age distribution of SES employees for the last five fiscal years. As of FY 2018, 25 percent of SES employees were younger than the age of 49.9 years; 50 percent were younger than the age of 55.0 years; and 75 percent were younger than the age of 59.8 years.

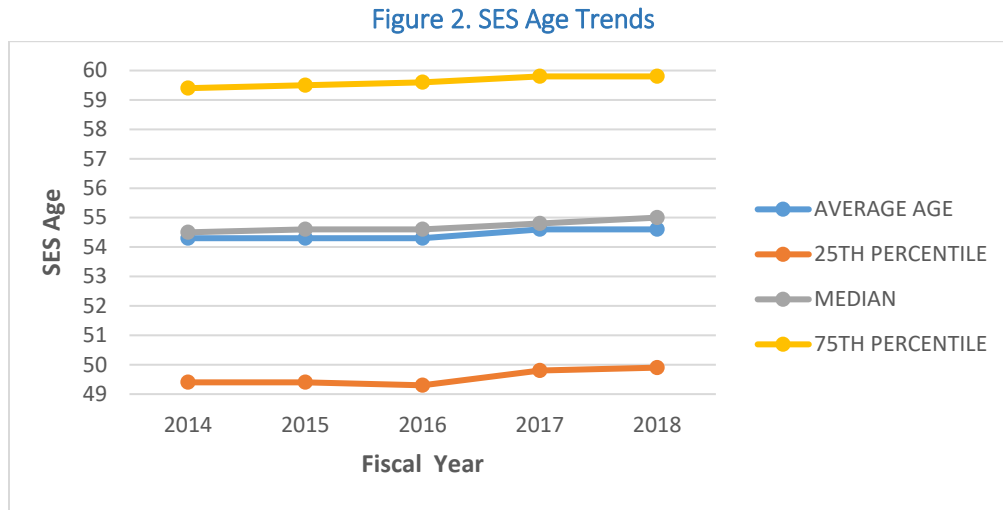

Figure 3. SES Gender Trends is a graphical representation of Table 7.

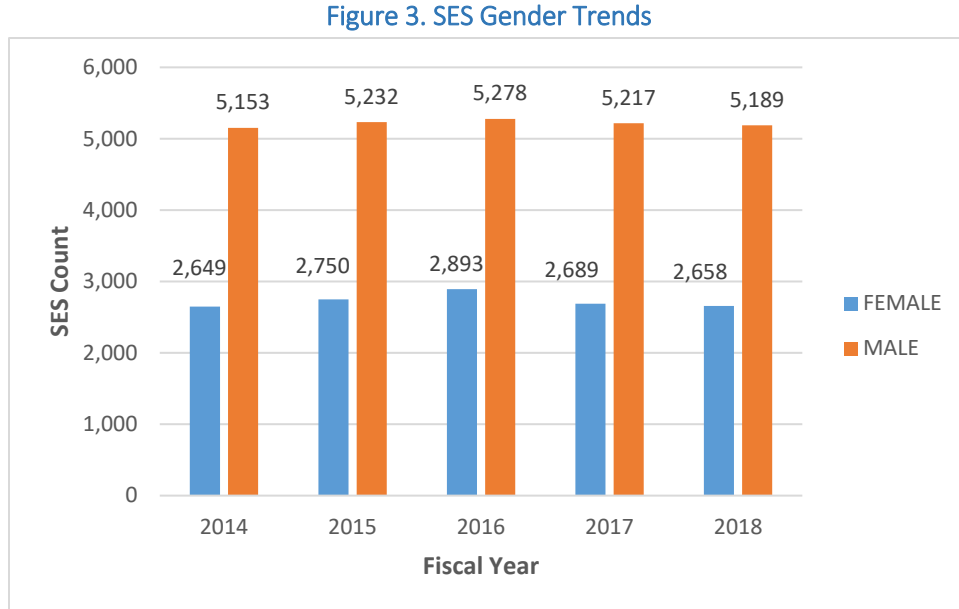

Table 12. SES Length of Service (LOS) Trends lists the LOS distribution of SES employees for the last five fiscal years. An employee's LOS is based on all prior federal service, not just their prior SES service. As of FY 2018, 25 percent of SES employees had served less than 13.6 years; 50 percent had served less than 23.4 years; and 75 percent had served less than 30.6 years.

Figure 4. SES LOS Trends is a graphical representation of Table 12. Figure 4 shows that SES LOS has been relatively stable over the last five fiscal years, with the exception of the 25th percentile.

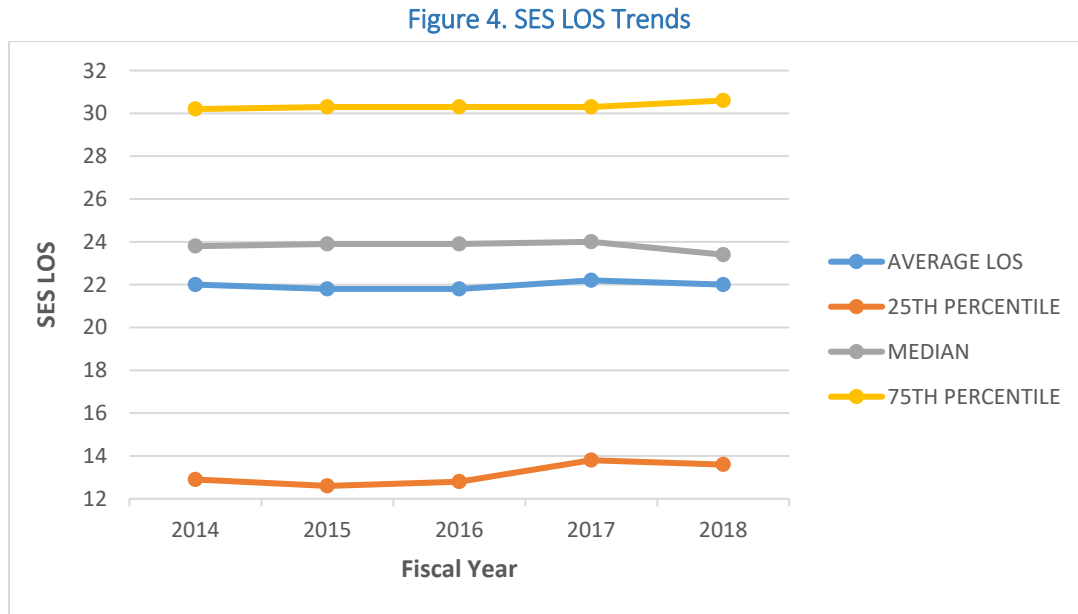


Table 13. SES Salary Trends lists the salary distribution of SES employees for the last five fiscal years. As of Fiscal Year 2018, 25 percent of SES employees earned less than \$173,000 per year; 50 percent earned less than \$179,900 a year; and 75 percent earned less than \$187,348 per year.

Figure 5. SES Salary Trends is a graphical representation of Table 13.

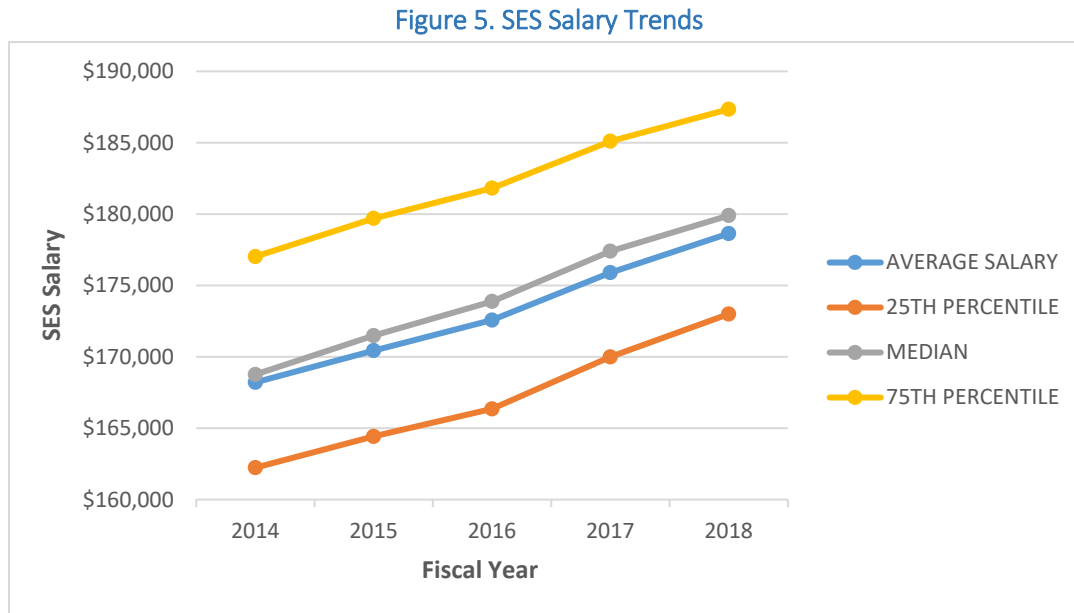
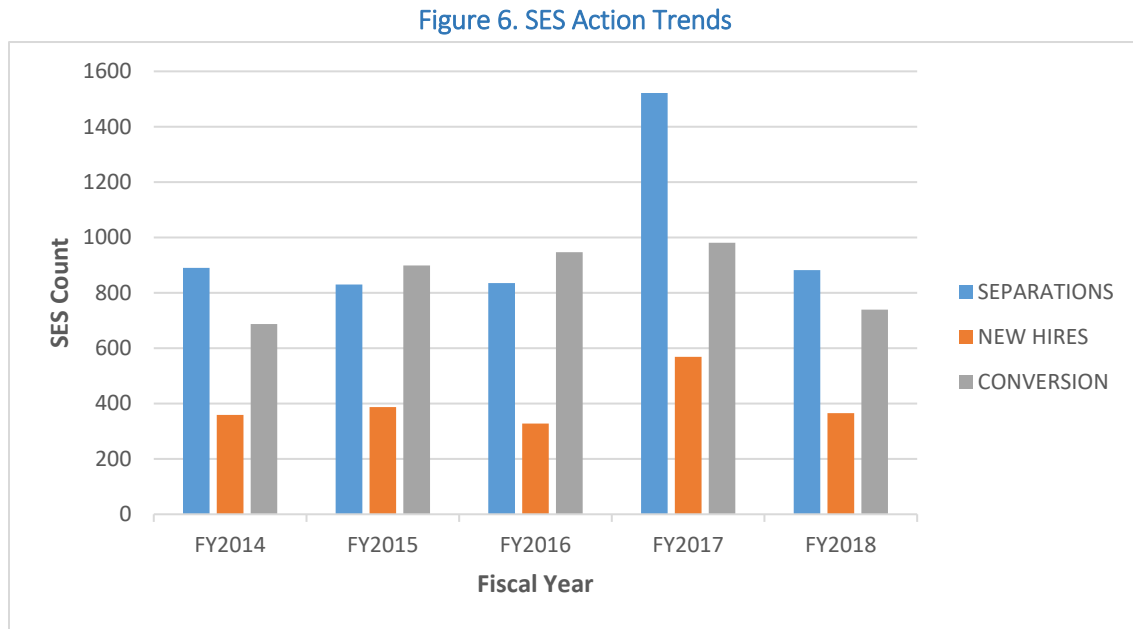
